

### This Week's Worship Value was "forgiveness"

#### Value of the Week

As Easter approaches, we have used the period of Lent to revisit the value of forgiveness. We learned the story of Esau and Jacob. Jacob did a bad thing and tricked Esau out of his birthright. This made Esau so angry that he wanted to kill Jacob. Thankfully, Esau chose not to hate but to forgive Jacob and the two brothers could once again live in peace.

Year 3 performed their class assembly yesterday and they explained how key leaders have chosen to forgive, rather than live in hate. We learned that Nelson Mandela forgave those who punished him for standing up to the Apartheid regime and this helped to bring peace to South Africa. What a great example of forgiveness!



As Easter approaches, we learn that forgiveness is a key part of the Easter story. Over the next two weeks, children will learn more of the Easter story and how God's forgiveness is an important message. We will celebrate the festival as a whole school and we hope that families will join us in the Easter Celebrations on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> March. See below for more details!

#### Easter is Coming!

As Easter draws near at the end of March, we will, in every class, celebrate the festival with our annual Easter enrichment work. During our R.E. lessons, we will be learning themes from the Easter story. Each class will also be "getting vocal" in their learning, using oracy skills (speaking and listening) to share their understanding of a small section of the story.

We are using a text called The Easter Story by Brian Wildsmith. You can read it with your child [here](#) The Easter story is told through the eyes of a donkey and we are celebrating this in our Easter Enrichment this year. The classes are creating Easter artefacts for a special treasure hunt in the Environmental Area and which will be signposted with donkeys. The donkeys and artefacts when found, reveal a letter which will spell out a message (when written in the order of the Easter story). There will be 15 donkeys to find altogether and we look forward to seeing families come down for the fun!

During the last week of term families are invited to do the trail for themselves after school on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> March. A small Easter prize will be given to those who complete the trail and staff will be on hand to help. We hope to see you there.

Junior pupils will also visit church for a special Easter experience. A "Question Time" panel of Easter characters will tell them more about the Easter story and children will receive a drink and a snack. The children will be accompanied by 3 members of the SACRE team. The team work with the Local Authority to monitor and advise on Religious Education so it will be fantastic to welcome them to view the wonderful Easter work that is shared between church and school.

On the final day of term, Maundy Thursday (28<sup>th</sup> March), Bishop Jill will visit school for our Easter assembly. We shall reveal a wonderful mosaic which is currently being worked on in school. Mrs Garstang has done a tremendous job with the children and the mosaic is nearly complete. We hope to show pictures of the finished mosaic before the end of term!
